Beamish Museum (Year 2)

Our Year2 children visited Beamish last week to support their history topic 'Children in the Victorian era'. They were full of excitement and chat on their return, captivated by what they were able to experience and see on their visit.

Rosie: *My favourite and most interesting bit was finding out about Victorian school and how strict the teachers were compared to ours. The girls and boys did not sit together in the actual Victorian school and they had different entrances.*

Great North Museum – Year 3

Year 3 visited the Great North Museum to develop their History learning as part of their study of Ancient Greece. During the visit, the pupils took part in an Ancient Greece workshop looking at the role of the hoplite.

The children explored the armour and equipment used by hoplites in the Ancient Greek army. They learned that hoplites wore protective bronze armour, including helmets, body armour and greaves. The workshop supported pupils' understanding of how hoplites fought in organised formations to defend their city, helping to bring their classroom learning to life.

Leo: *I liked learning about how the hoplites fought on land and boats. I also saw a Newcastle United football shirt.*

Hollie: *The hoplites had very heavy armour and they had to wear breast plates which means when they are in war, they are protected and the enemy is put off fighting them.*

Jake: *I liked the sword and I was able to put it on my shoulders. I put the helmet on and it was very heavy.*

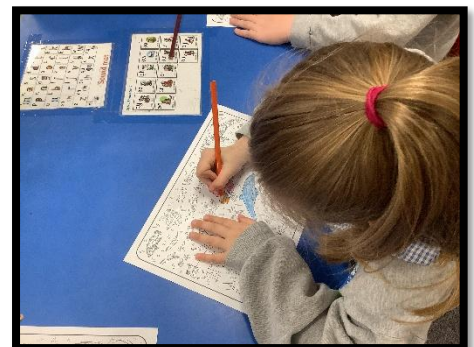
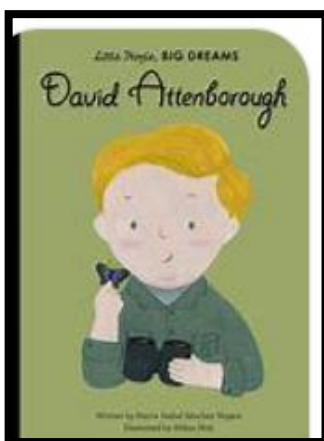
Happy 100th birthday Sir David!
